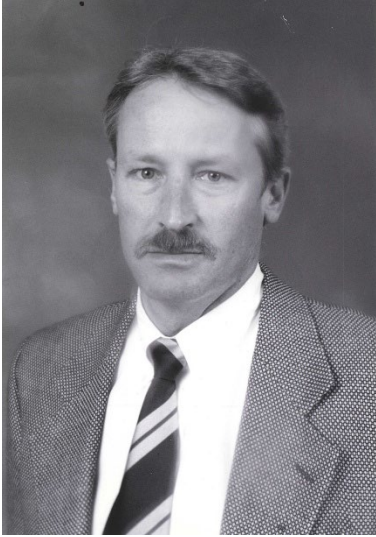


Bill Haliburton



Bill Haliburton spent decades as one of Canadian wrestling's most respected officials, contributing at every level of the sport.

At the provincial level, he officiated for 21 years, served on the Executive of the Alberta Amateur Wrestling Officials Association for 14 years, and was a member of the Edmonton Amateur Wrestling Association for 22 years. He also worked as a clinician for the AAWOA for 15 years, helping develop officiating standards across the province.

Nationally, his officiating record speaks for itself — 30 Senior National Championships, 18 Junior Nationals, 15 Cadet/Juvenile Nationals, 7 CIAU Championships, and 4 Olympic Trials. He served on the Canadian Amateur Wrestling Officials Association Board of Directors for 10 years, and worked as a national clinician for 12 years. He was recognized with the Don Marrin Long Term Service Award and named an Honorary Lifetime Member of the CAWOA.

Internationally, Haliburton held FILA International official status for 17 years, achieving FILA Exceptionelle status from 1991 to 1996. He officiated at 5 World Championships, 1 World Cup, and the 1992 Olympic qualifying event.

Haliburton's career represents an exceptional level of dedication to the craft of officiating and to the development of wrestling in Alberta and Canada.
