Breanne began wrestling at 12 through her junior high school program and never really stopped. She competed through high school and university, earned a spot on the national team, and spent years travelling the world representing Canada.

She retired at 27 to start a family, but after four years and two children, she came back. She then competed for Canada for another eight years, a testament to both her ability and her commitment to the sport.

Her competitive record is substantial: 12 national titles, two junior world championship medals, and three Pan American Championship medals, including silver in 2015 and 2018 and bronze in 2016.

She also served as head coach of Team Alberta Women's for the 2021 Canada Summer Games and as lead coach of the University of Calgary Junior Dinos wrestling program, passing on her experience to the next generation of Alberta wrestlers.
